

Pilsen is a statutory city in the west of Bohemia and the metropolis of the Pilsen region. It lies at the confluence of the Mže, Radbuza, Úhlava and Úslava rivers. 169,000 inhabitants live here, that’s making Pilsen the fourth largest city in the Czech Republic.

Monuments:

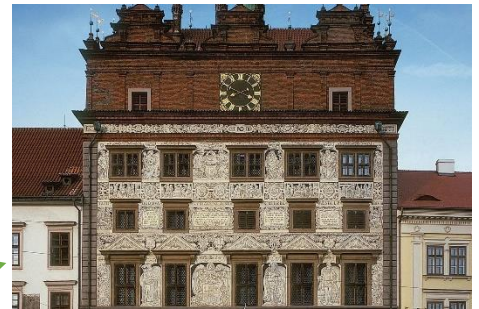
Divadlo J. K. Tyla – is the main theater in the Pilsen region and an important cultural center of the city of Pilsen. It has three stages, the Great Theatre, the New Theater and the Small Stage. The Neo-Renaissance Theater is one of the important immovable cultural monuments of the city. The capacity of the hall is 444 seats.



St. Bartholomew's Cathedral – is a Gothic church located on original church was probably founded together with the construction of the current one began after 1342. It is a tallest church tower in the Czech Republic).



The Great Synagogue – is the largest synagogue in the Czech Republic. It is also the second largest synagogue in Europe.
